Over five miles of trails grace the ridges and ravines within Shelton View Forest. This tranquil space has long been a favorite of locals, including hikers, runners, mountain bikers, dog owners, wildlife photographers, and students.

The forest provides critical habitat for wildlife in an urban setting. More than fifty species of birds live or visit here, including owls and woodpeckers. On occasion, deer, bobcat, and coyote have been seen. Native fern, Salal, and Oregon grape grow beneath a canopy of cedar, big leaf maple, and Douglas fir.

The forest is located within a 10 minute drive for over 45,000 Bothell residents, and is a draw for outdoor enthusiasts throughout the region. Visit today and join us in protecting it for current and future generations.





Shelton View Forest

Shelton View Forest is located in northwest Bothell and is comprised of roughly 42 acres within a larger forested canopy. It is owned by the Department of Natural Resources and private owners. The forest is listed as priority habitat by the Department of Fish and Wildlife and is located within the Swamp Creek Watershed, making it an ideal candidate for preservation.
